The denotative region becomes the linguistic level because it is straightforward, objective and what it is, that is, as the primary model of language. While the meaning of connotation is the meaning associated to the implicit meaning, hidden and deep meaning based on the interaction with signifier, signify, sign, emotions, and cultural values. Based on the concept of Barthes, William Wordswort's poem titled *I Wandered Lonely As a Cloud (Daffodils)* has two symbolic meaning of Barthes' theory they are the denotation explicitly and the connotation that implicitly existed on its poem. Furthermore, the symbol of Wordswort's poem seems like a shift of symbolic meaning between denotation and connotation as a literary work.
